

Primary school sport funding (Pssf) Grant Expenditure  
April 2016 to April 2017  
Thornhill Primary School

We welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding for 2 years to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

Ambition: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport at Thornhill Primary School through:

- Increased engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- Raising the profile of P.E and sport across the school
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport
- Broader experiences of a range of sports and activities offered to pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Rationale in spending Pssf:

We use our funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Through:

1. Buying into Winterhill "competition package and EIS days for KS1 and KS2" to engage pupils with peers within the learning community at sporting events.
2. Paying for transport, pool hire and instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for those pupils unable to swim by the end of Y4.
3. Purchasing specialist coaching through Rob Lyne in coaching an after school sports programme. Building on PE skills lessons, he aims for children to achieve highly in sports participation events. The four hours of quality after school coaching in multi sports, football and gifted and talented provision has helped the school achieve level 3 status for participation at county level.
